



## COVID-19 Update:

### The Plaza at Mililani Community-wide Testing Results

September 16, 2021

On Saturday, September 11, 2021 a notification was sent out sharing that a Team Member whose assignment was restricted to the 2<sup>nd</sup> floor at The Plaza at Mililani had tested positive for COVID-19. As a result, all who may have come into close contact were informed and all Residents residing on the 2nd floor were administered COVID-19 antigen tests, two of which unfortunately, were presumed positive. Due to these results, and per the guidance of the Hawaii State Department of Health, community-wide COVID-19 PCR testing was conducted on Tuesday, September 14, 2021 for all Residents and Team Members. To-date, all results from the community-wide testing initiative have been received, with four additional confirmed positive Residents and three confirmed positive Team Members.

Residents who tested positive for COVID-19 have been relocated to an isolation section of the building and were offered Regeneron\* injection treatments (to be provided in-house) through Premier Medical Group. All other Residents are quarantining in their apartments. Team Members who have tested positive are recovering and isolating at home.

The Plaza at Mililani will continue to work with the Department of Health and follow their instruction regarding required isolation, quarantining and testing. Arrangements for additional community-wide testing through Premier Medical Group have been made for all Team Members and Residents to occur on-site at The Plaza at Mililani on **Tuesday, September 21, 2021 between 9:00am-10:30am**. Testing for Residents will be conducted in their apartments.

At this time, communal activities and dining for the entire community have been cancelled. Meals will be delivered to each Resident in their apartment. Per the Department of Health, all Residents are asked to refrain from non-essential activities outside of the community. Additionally, we are not allowing in-person/on-site visits (except for end of life situations), tours, new admissions and readmissions, until further notice.

We thank you for your patience and understanding as we work expeditiously toward getting The Plaza at Mililani COVID-19 free. In order to achieve this goal, all Team Members are being asked to only focus on the most urgent tasks. During this time, we ask that all non-essential requests be held off.

*\* Regeneron's treatment, called REGEN-COV, is a combination of two types of monoclonal antibodies. Monoclonal antibodies work by targeting the coronavirus spike protein, blocking the virus from entering your body's cells, and stopping the infection from spreading.*
